Mississippi Section Report for April 2022

The last entries for the 2022 MSQP were logged in on April 30. This year 270 logs were received as compared with about the same number of 283 last year. What is noticeable in scanning the logs is the increased activity on 40M SSB by Mississippi Stations which was greatly appreciated by stations out of range of 3862. Also, 15M CW activity increased as compared with years past due to the upswing on Cycle 25. And as also in years past the pileups on 20 SSB seemed to have no bottom. Now it is time for the log checkers to go to work and the winners determined. Results should be available in about a month.

From ASM K0UPW: It was a beautiful day for the 2022 Natchez Trace Century Ride, a bike ride that covers an area on and off the Natchez Trace Parkway. The Ride consists of 25, 50, 62- and 100-miles rides with 1,005 persons signed up to participate. Turned out to be a great ride with no injuries.

The ride net controls, Jim, AK5J and Frank, K4FMH kept everything under control on the Sharon 145.450 repeater with a backup repeater on the CMSARA 147.345 repeater.

Jim, AE5SK, manned the Goshen Springs Rest Stop. Zion Chapel AMZ Church was covered by Mike, K5XU and Kathleen, K5KKD. This really kept us jumping. The Robinson Rest Stop was worked by Kerry, N5KLT. The 100-mile turnaround was manned by Mike, WM5A and Jack, K5FIT.

A map in the article showing the mean number of EF1+ Tornado Days per year within 25 miles of a point 1986-2015 shows that ground zero is now Eastern Louisiana, Central Mississippi, and Northwest Alabama.
