## **Mississippi Section Report for July 2023**

From SEC KC5IMN: Mississippi ARES conducted its statewide Simulated Emergency Test (SET for short) on Saturday 12 Aug 2023. The MS ARES team spent the last 7 months planning and training for this operation and initial reports are that the SET was very successful. The MS ARES Team operated for 12 continuous hours beginning at 430am and completing the day at 430pm. Numerous instances of simulation emergency communications were passed via Amateur Radio networks on behalf of local, county, and state organizations. In case you missed it, this year's SET scenario was a landfalling hurricane named ICYMI. ARES County emergency operations as well as MS State RACES operators also got into the fray. Everyone that checked into the nets got a lot of traffic handling experience for when the real deal happens.

For 2023, there was significant use of NBEMS digital as well as WINLINK-email that was directed to the main state level served agency, the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA). While the scenario included a hurricane, there were also power disruptions, flooding, tornados, traffic accidents, and even a downed NASA satellite that the Civil Air Patrol simulated a search and recover effort in the Tupelo area.

Robert would like to thank everyone that participated in this year's test. He appreciates the Hams that gave up their Saturday to test the MS ARES machine. (in W5XX's opinion this was the very best SET ever. When you see Robert or run across him on the air give him a pat on the back for the many hours he spent organizing the 2023 SET)

... and now on to the DX front. All Hams like to work some DX at one time or another. If you work hard, you can make DXCC in a weekend during a contest. If you want to make the DXCC Honor Roll allow about 20 years. To make it the Top of the Honor Roll allow about 30 years, if you are lucky and all of the entities are on the air. Well, there is one more giant step. 3000 on the DXCC challenge. With 340 entities on the list, it looks like a Ham would need 300 entities on 10 bands. To make 300 entities on 6 Meters is impossible. That means a DXer would have to make more than 300 entities on the other 9 bands, Good Luck! Well, K2FF in Ocean Springs did exactly that. Congratulations to Glenn to being the first in Mississippi to make 3,000 on the DX Challenge!

JARC President AK5J reports that Hams from the Jackson Amateur Radio Club, the Central Mississippi Amateur Radio Association, and the Vicksburg Amateur Radio Club assisted with communications for the Soul City Cycling Summer Sizzler Bike Ride on July 15. There were about 200 bike riders in this event. Hams were placed at all rest stops and major intersections and gave progress reports and reported any problems. The event was very well organized and went very smoothly except for one rider who fell down but was not seriously injured. The ride officials were very complimentary of the Hams and the help they provided. Hams participating were K5XU, K5KKD, AK5J, K4FMH, N5KLT, K5ERB, KG4HRG, AC5Z, K15MJT, W5VMS, and K5CID.

In Field Day after action information K0UPW reports from Rankin County ... The preliminary Field Day 2023-point totals are in, and we DOUBLED last year's totals due to the large number of CW and digital (FT8) contacts made. 632 points for CW, 816 points for Digital, and 427 points for Phone. We accumulated 1,130 bonus points (media, education, etc.) plus a multiplier. The preliminary total for Field Day 2023 was 4,880 points. Also, the Field Day Contact Map shows the group contacted all but one section in the U.S. -- and that section was San Francisco (SF).

From ACC W5UMS: MEMA offers a wide variety of training opportunities for emergency first responders and support personnel. For ARRL/ARES members, the most significant resident courses include FEMA's ICS-300 and ICS-400. Applying for MEMA training is a two-step process. First, request access to the training course website (instructions at https://68rd9e.a2cdn1.secureserver.net/wp-content/uploads/2020/09/Requesting-System-Access.pdf). Second, register for a training course (instructions at https://68rd9e.a2cdn1.secureserver.net/wp-content/uploads/2020/09/Registering-for-a-Training-Course.pdf). Courses are offered at various times throughout the state. Individuals are responsible for any travel and/or lodging expenses, as well as all prerequisite coursework. From W5VMS in Warren/Claiborne Counties: KG5OVR, KG5YEE, and W5VMS attempted to check in for the July EMCOMM Checkin. Audio was good at first, but they lost signal and were unable to check in on 3862. This has been a recurring problem with the Warren County EOC. This time the most likely culprit was atmospheric conditions, but 80 meters is not good for local comms (line-of-sight between stations is around 6 miles). Possible solutions for the future include relocating EOC comms or checking in on 2 meters.
